SOLUTIONS

In Chile, the implementation of the first National Restoration Plan begins, an initiative of the Council of Ministers for Sustainability that seeks to restore one million hectares until 2030. This plan is a National Determined Contribution approved during COP25. More information [here](#)

In Bolivia, a survey reveals that 8 out of 10 adolescents have anguish, depression and anxiety due to their social, family, and personal context affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. 75% have not sought psycho-emotional help, 61% do not know who or where to turn. More information [here](#)
